The elementary school had a wonderful start to the new year. We are full in all K-5 classes now. Here is our current breakdown

- This year I would like to submit our Annual Performance Report for our continuous improvement plan. This is the first year we can do this as a charter school. However, we still need to make sure you know about our improvement goals and keep you updated on those goals. At the elementary level, we are continuing to improve in the areas of math and reading. We want to continue to work on our guaranteed viable standards (these standards all students will master before moving on to the next grade level). We are also working on making sure our assessments are measuring the standards we are teaching. In the area of reading, we are also working on being trained and implementing reading intervention in grades K-3 and 4-5. We have our training this Friday and then will build the intervention into our schedules to give to the SDE. I will get your thoughts on our strategic goals at the board meeting. We will need to post these goals on our website.
- We will hold our Walk-a-Thon on September 21, 2023. The theme for this year is A "Mazing"
 Heroes. We will hold it at the New Sweden Farms. We are looking forward to seeing all the
 heroes running and walking. Each child who participates will receive a treat.
- The Teacher Professional Development went well over the past few weeks. It was a good reminder for GE to come in and talk about creating a positive atmosphere within the classroom and school setting. It goes great with our Positive Behavioral Intervention Supports. We also had the SDE come in and train us on the Best Practices to use with English Learners.
- We have some teachers who would like to attend a matinee on March 28th. It will be Light Wire. These performers use music and light to create a story. It will be a great opportunity for them to attend. We could use some of our fundraising funds to help provide this opportunity to our student if there is not enough donations.
- I have a teacher who would love to start the process of having a 4H group here at our school. This group would focus on Government and other areas. 4H is a great program that has much to offer our students in many areas. It is something that could start off slowly around the area of government etc. and then expand over time.

- I have also asked to have one person from each building along with admin to meet as a safety committee to hold meetings to discuss areas of need. We will get this going very soon and meet throughout the year.
- We will have a Federal Programs Audit this coming year. It will be a desk audit and it will be held in February. I will keep everyone updated on how we do and any areas of improvement within these programs.
- We have found a PFA President for this year. Annie Bradford has volunteered again to help in this area. She will be at the Board Meeting this week.
- I am working with our new facilities manager, Marty Pettingill, to get the Wall Ball put up sometime this year. We just need to discuss where it will be located and then Marty will help me get it going. There is money from the fundraiser a few years ago that we have saved for this purpose.
- Just in case we forgot to say something last month, we do have a new Facilities Manager, Marty Pettingill. He has done a great job and is so willing to help. We are happy to have him as part of our team.

We have a wonderful staff here at AHCS. Everyone is working hard to ensure the school year starts great.
