Administrative, PFA, and Student Reports and Recommendations

Elementary Update

Dr. Hurst reported on the following:

I hope everyone is doing well. There are so many great and exciting things happening within our school and I look forward to reporting this information. If you have any questions regarding any of this information, please reach out to me.

- * AHCS now has its own 4H program. The name of our 4H Club is the American Heritage 4H Club. We will hold our first meeting tonight, November 8, 2023, right after school. The projects offered include Know Your Government, My Heritage, Idaho Wildlife, and Model Rockets. It will be great to provide students with these opportunities over this coming school year.
- * Tools of Life will be coming to our area this year in Idaho Falls. This program provides support to students with disabilities, their families, and educators. This program is done every year in Idaho, but this year it is in our neighborhood. We would like our students to have the opportunity to attend. This program will be on March 4th and March 5th at the Mountain America Center. The cost for students is \$10 and educators are free. The cost for parents is \$80. There will be a guest keynote speaker and breakout sessions people can attend. The areas they will focus on include the following:

- * I would like to get permission spend some student funds to do a Polar Express activity for the students. I would love for the students to attend school in their Pajamas (over their uniforms that day). We would decorate the gym to look like Christmas and the Polar Express. We will have the students go into the gym in the afternoon where they will be greeted by the train conductor and the wait staff. We will have hot cocoa, and chocolate chip cookies for each student. We will watch the Polar Express and stop the movie when they get to the North Pole and the bell. Santa then will visit our students and present to them with their own Christmas Bell. After Santa leaves we will continue the show.
- * We will begin our Christmas Service Project On November 16, 2023. We will be giving out to each class K-5 their adoptive grandparent's name and the items they have on their wish list. We will plan on taking them to deliver those gifts on December 13, 2023. I appreciate Angie's help in getting this setup for the school.
- * We have attended three meetings on our Federal Grant and we should be up and running soon with being able to move forward with pulling down funds. We received \$1.56 million to help with our 7-12 grade expansion.

- * We will begin our Afterschool Reading Program on December 5, 2023. This program will meet on Tuesdays and Thursdays throughout the rest of the school year. We have teachers who have said they will help students during this time with their reading skills. We just sent out the invites and I will be able to report how many accepted the invite by our next board meeting.
- * We are looking forward for the new building to be completed. It has been fun watching the building site change over the past few months. Thanks to everyone who has made this effort possible.
- * Our Christmas Program is fast approaching. It will be held on December 11, 2023. Save the Date for this wonderful event. More information will be provided at a later date.
- *I have attached the newsletter that was sent out for November. We are looking forward to the Veterans Day Assembly tomorrow, Thursday, November 9, 2023. We have invited the Veterans in to eat lunch with the students. We will have one Veteran that we know of attend that is 102 years old and served in WWII. What a special day tomorrow and we look forward to thanking all of our Veterans who have served. Thank you to Tappia for helping with a great token to give to each of the service men and women who come in tomorrow.
- *We held our first Parent Teacher Conferences this past month. We had a great turnout. During this time, we did inform our parents about our Title I program. We have a Parent Involvement Policy that was provided to them and we did inform those that they can make suggestions for this policy. We then have to present the policy to the board to review every year. Currently, it is the same policy since there were no suggestions given.
